July is perhaps our busiest month, and one of my favorite times of year. That's because in addition to all of our regular activities, our hallways are also filled with the sounds of children. This year we have over 60 children and youth signed up for our Vacation Bible School. Some of these kids have been coming to Beth-El for years, while for some this will be a new experience.



Several of these “new kids” are the grandchildren of one of our long-time community members. Her daughter, Monica, was able to seek asylum in this country after her life, and the life of her one-year old daughter were threatened by the child’s father. Monica faced horrific abuse that I cannot possibly convey or imagine. She had been beaten, her ribs broken, and had a knife held against her throat and her child’s. Thankfully, she and her children were allowed

to stay with her mom here in Wimauma while her case awaits trial. She has to wear an ankle bracelet, but she is safe.

It is practically impossible to turn on the news these days without hearing something about the state of our borders and the immigration crisis. Monica said that she would never have let anyone take her children from her, thankfully she did not have to. But what would the alternative have been—to stay in a life-threatening situation? Stories like hers remind us of the complexity our nation faces, and the goodness that still abounds in our humanity. I can’t tell you how much I am looking forward to hearing those little voices this summer. There is no greater joy than to hear a child’s laughter.

Every day a new story unfolds at Beth-El. Please pray, and join us in the journey.
