Yet, most parents will tell you how much they hunger for their children to have better opportunities for education, so that their children's lives may be better than their own.

Beth-El supports the farm working community through its weekly food pantry and community dinners, and through scholarship programs for young and old. For those who hunger for spiritual nurture, Beth-El provides weekly worship services on Sunday and Tuesday in Spanish.

A farmworker's life is very hard, enduring long hours from daybreak to sunset in difficult physical labor.

Farm workers are paid based on the amount they pick--usually only pennies a pound. A worker picking tomatoes must pick 4000 pounds a day to earn between \$40 to \$80. Annually a migrant family earns between \$7,000 to \$15,000 a year.

Through its programs and partnerships, Beth-El promotes and advocates to improve the lives of farm workers and their families.

Healthy Living

Beth-El supports over 80,000 people every year through our hunger relief initiatives.

Now, thanks to partnerships with area educators, nutritionists and medical agencies, the Beth-El food pantry now offers fresh fruits and vegetables on a regular basis.

In addition to the produce, Beth-El also includes recipes and samples for families to try at home. Bi-annual health screenings by area nurses enable us to track progress.
